Rioters go on the rampage in Sitra

RIOTERS went on a rampage in Sitra yesterday after they visited the grave of a man whose family claims he died as a result of complications from inhaling tear gas.

The Public Prosecution's Special Investigations Unit earlier concluded the unnamed Bahraini died in hospital on March 14 as a result of lung failure caused by respiratory diseases. It confirmed there was no sign of

tear gas in his lungs.

The *GDN* witnessed rioters, holding pictures of the deceased, blocking roads leading to the area where he lived with burning tyres.

They also threw stones and Molotov cocktails at police, who responded with tear gas.
Saboteurs blocked Budaiya Highway near the

Country Mall with burning tyres at around 3pm sparking traffic chaos.

Meanwhile, a suspicious object was found on Shaikh Khalifa bin Salman Highway.
