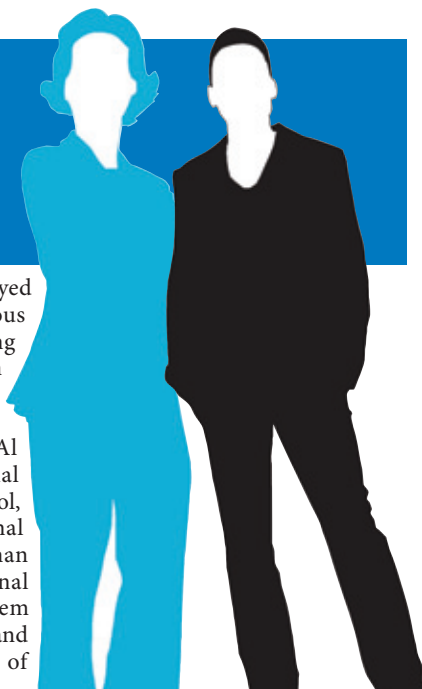
The trading champions
