Marriages alert

MARRIAGE between blood relatives is the main cause of genetic and metabolic diseases in the Arabian Gulf. "The incidence of such diseases in the GCC and Bahrain exceed the international rates," said Arabian Gulf University paediatric Professor Dr Abdulaziz Al Ameen. He warned against endogamy, which is the main cause of incidence of genetic and metabolic disorders in Gulf societies.

He stressed the need to examine new-born babies to ensure early detection of genetic diseases which may cause mental retardation, disabilities and death. According to updated statistics, an average of 20,000 babies are born every year in Bahrain.

Four held for selling SIMs to terrorists

SIM cards to terrorists have been taken into custody pending inves-

Police investigation has revealed that the SIMs were used to detonate booby-trapped cars using mobile phones

The accused buy phone lines, using fake names and wrong data from previous customers, and sell them to other people, at a profit.

They were in possession of

more than 1,000 SIM cards when police arrested them, said a report in our sister paper Akhbar Al

Appearing before the Public Prosecution, they admitted to trading in SIM cards illegally.

One of the suspects was found in possession of a machine for selling cards and phone numbers.

How to Protect Your Passport?

Dear Citizen Before Travelling You Should:

- ★ Check the validity of your passport, some countries impose a condition that the passport should be valid for a period of 6 months or more.
- Obtain the visa (if required) for the countries you are planning to visit.
- Check the validity of the ticket and if the name on it matches your name in the passport (this should be checked while booking the
- ★ Keep photocopies of your passport and other documents in a file and keep e-copies on your e-mail account.
- Keep important documents such as the passport, the ticket and travellers' cheques securely and protect them

The Nationality, Passports and Residence Affairs (NPRA) is keen to ensure your trip abroad is comfortable. In order to avoid any inconvenience please keep in view the following:

- ★ Protect your passport
- ★ Provide your embassy (if there is one) with a copy of your passport and keep a copy in your e-mail to help in case your passport goes missing
- Call your embassy (if there is one) to report in case your passport is lost or goes missing.
- Remember that your passport is an important document and can be used against you and your country. Protect it as it is part of you.

You can renew your passport at:

- 1- NPRA headquarters in the Capital Governorate in the Exhibition road from 7:30 AM to 7:00 PM
- 2- Passport office at the Security Service Building in the Muharraq Governorate from 7:30 AM to 7:00 PM.
- 3- Passport office at the Central Governorate in Isa Town from 7:30 AM to 2:00 PM.
