King ratifies agreement

HIS Majesty yesterday issued a law ratifying the Agreement Encouraging and Protecting Investments, signed between Bahrain and Tajikistan. It stipulates that the agreement, signed in Manama on May 28, 2014, will be implemented by the Prime Minister and relevant ministers, and will be published in the Official Gazette.

MP asked to pay BD7,600

A Bahrain court has ordered an MP to pay BD7,600 as outstanding rent. A landlord filed a complaint at the Urgent Matters Court against the MP, who failed to pay rent for two months, according to court documents. He said that he had agreed to lease a building for BD3,800 monthly to the MP, who turned it into a restaurant.

However, the MP ignored the payments for two months and the court yesterday ordered him to be kicked out of the building in Adliya and to pay back
