The admission counter will be open from 9:00am to 1:30pm on all working days till Thursday, 1st June 2017.

"The process of applying to the Polytechnic this year will be done through the internet, which has been the case for the past 4 years and received positive feedback." added Malalla.

The applicant has to fill the online application form through the website (http://www.polytechnic.bh), print the signature page, pay the application fee (BD20 non-refundable) by debit or credit card at the Student Information Centre (Building 8), and submit

the required documents: an original and copy of passport and smart card, one passport size photo, high school transcript, evidence of good conduct (not more than one year old), medical examination certificate from governmental health centre.

The Registry Directorate will then verify the documents, go through the selection process, and set a date for the entry tests.

Due to limited vacancies, the selection of applicants to Bahrain Polytechnic will be 'very competitive'. Malalla advised

that applicants who meet the minimum high school GPA requirements of at least 70% (to be provided with the graduation certificate), and pass the entry test scheduled to begin on 30th April 2017 are not guaranteed to be selected, as it depends on the programme requirements and the number of vacant seats in that year. Malalla recommends that applicants apply to more than one educational institution to ensure the potential applicant does not miss the opportunity for higher education.

Bahrain Polytechnic offers the following academic programmes: Bachelor of Business, Bachelor of International Logistics Management, Bachelor of Information and Communications Technology, Bachelor of Engineering Technology, Bachelors of Web Media, Bachelors of Visual Design.
