Registration and payment process

Based on HEC instructions, the student is not allowed to register in two or more different programmes simultaneously whether in Bahrain Polytechnic or in any other institutes.

Foundation and Degree students

Registering for more than 65 credits

All students can register up to 65 Credits if they are not on Probation.

Students can register up to 75 Credits IF:

- o their programme structure requires it;
- o they have a CGPA of 3 or higher, OR
- o are eligible to graduate in that semester.

You must submit an "Application to Increase Semester Credits" form to the SIC at least **one full working day** prior to your Programmes registration release date and time to be processed. Late applications will be processed. No guarantee of a place in any class is given.

Fee Payment

Students who have completed registration, can pay course fees by ATM or Credit card to the Finance Directorate from 9am to 2.00pm in Building **11.114.**

- ALL fees must be paid in full before 2.00pm 2 March 2016.
- Students with unpaid fees after 2 March 2017 will have a late fee applied.
 Outstanding fees may be paid during the grace period from 5 to 9 March 2017.
- From 12 March 2016, any unpaid course fees will result in the course registration being dropped; a Finance Hold will be placed on the student account and ALL fees <u>remain due</u> and must be paid in full.

All fees must be paid in full before the student can continue their study in the next semester.

Online Payment

Students can pay their fees online starting from:

- Online payment will be open from 7
 February at 9am until 2 March at 2pm.
- Students with unpaid fees after 2 March 2017 will have a late fee applied.
 Outstanding fees may be paid during the grace period from 5 March at 12pm to 9 March 2017 at 2:00pm.
- Note: Online payment will be close every day from 2pm to 3pm.

ICDL is made up of a range of modules – each module provides a practical program of up-to-date skills and knowledge areas, which are validated by an online test.

This course consists of two Modules from the four Base Modules; these modules are Computer Essentials and Online Essentials. Candidate will learn the key concepts relating to ICT, computers, devices and software. In addition to understanding the main concepts relating to web browsing and online security.

Course Title: Course Code ICPL - Word Processing and Spreadsheets GS5806 5

ICDL is made up of a range of modules – each module provides a practical program of up-to-date skills and knowledge areas, which are validated by an online test.

This course consists of two Modules from the four Base Modules; these modules are Word Processing and SpreadSheets. Candidate will learn the key skills needed to use a word processing application in addition to the key skills needed to use spreadsheets.

Course Title: Course Code ICDL – Database GS5807 Credits

This course will explore how farming and hunting have shaped notions of gender and community; how surplus food has created wealth and poverty; what cinnamon had to do with the discovery of America and the story of coffee from its discovery on a hill in ancient Abyssinia to the advent of Starbucks. Students will see how the spice trade resulted in the first great wave of globalization and how salt was so valuable it served as currency and influenced the establishment of trade routes and cities, provoked and financed wars, secured empires, and inspired revolutions.

This exciting course will lead you on an exploration through a variety of literacies. Texts studied will bring you back to your childhood as we look at the importance of children's picture books and encourage you to reflect on how traditional tales change across cultures. Course Title: Course Code Credits

The aim of this highly fulfilling course is to give participants a key set of coaching skills that can be utilised in the provision of one-to-one or group-based support to facilitate people in achieving their life and / or work goals.

They learn about various general practices and techniques, for example, powerful questioning, reframing and clarification to apply in the session. Learners are required to conduct a real one to one coaching session with a client and apply a coaching model that guides them throughout the session.

Course Title: Course Code Credits
Comics and Culture GS6309 15

This course aims at developing research, creative and analytical skills through the medium of comic books and relate these to contemporary culture. Students will be required to reference relevant facts, themes and terminology of the comic book genre in their research regarding the evolution of comic books in the 20th and 21st centuries. Students will compare and contrast different text from a cultural literacy viewpoint.

Course Title:	Course Code	Credits
Football and Globalization	GS6308	15

This course aims at developing students' understanding of Globalization, within the medium of Sport with a focus on football. Students will acquire knowledge through active self-study and collaboration. The course will encourage active self-motivated learning, creativity, curiosity and critical thinking. Topics covered include history and rules of the game, and problems in world football such as politics and corruption at the international level. Students are required to research a topic on the globalization of football applying concepts learned and present their findings in a written report.

ALL students are welcome on the course. If you know very little or know a great deal you are welcome. Female students are welcome.

Course Title: Course Code Debate and Public Speaking GS6507 Credits

This course aims at developing students' critical thinking, reasoning, research and listening skills through debate and public speaking. The course will introduce students to systematic strategies that will help them form arguments, synthesize information from a variety of sources to draw conclusions and present them coherently. Students will form thoughtful, creative, and specific questions relevant to the topic of the argument. Students will use appropriate note-taking techniques for listening and/or researching to include succinct key facts and statistics which directly answer identified research questions.
