(CPIT). The programme models international standards of good teaching practice and provides an introduction to the Polytechnic's unique model of Problem Based Learning by looking at the three key

areas of the Adult Learner, Classroom Practice, and the Use of Technology in Teaching and Learning in Higher Education.

The Certificate in Tertiary Teaching and Learning is

recognised by the Bahrain's QQA as a Level 6 award and is a critical pedagogical strategy for the Polytechnic and a unique and visionary programme in Bahrain and regionally. It has been recognised for

its contribution to teaching excellence by numerous international experts and Bahrain Polytechnic is currently seeking the UK's Higher Education Academy accreditation.
